Responsibilities: Supervise offenders, including sex offenders, on probation using the eight principles of effective intervention, perform field visits and searches, complete pre-sentence investigation reports, conduct drug and alcohol testing, complete risk assessments, attend court hearings and testify as needed, and other duties as assigned.

Requirements: Must be 21 years of age and a US citizen. Must be able to obtain Probation Officer certification and Risk Assessment Certification (IRAS). Preference will be given to those who already possess these certifications. Must have a valid driver's license and demonstrated safe driving record. Must have excellent writing and communication skills. Must be able to work evening and weekend hours, travel to trainings which require over-night stays, and be able to work in a team environment.
